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

## THE MOST WONDERFUL WOMAN



This year we celebrate the Annunciation of Our Lady on 4 April. As it comes after the Holy Week and the Easter Week, it is the occasion for us to express our gratitude to the Blessed Virgin Mary for having made our salvation possible through her acceptance of the whole plan of God with all the joys and sorrows this collaboration entailed.

Now, Our Lady does not feel any pain, any sadness any longer. For her, it is eternal bliss in the company of her Divine Son and all the elect, saints and angels. And yet, Our Lady is not completely taken up by her heavenly activities to the point of forgetting us for she is still very much interested in what is happening in this valley of tears.

Like Judith in the Old Testament, the Blessed Virgin Mary, while on earth, had a political mind, meaning she had the destiny of her people, the chosen people, at heart. Like everybody else in Judea, she yearned for a liberator, the Messiah, who would come and free the Jews from the mistreatments they were receiving from Herod and his Roman masters.

Such a political mind she still has and today she remains very interested in human affairs; even the secular press acknowledges that truth like National Geographic, the famous American magazine, that published a long article on "Mary, the most powerful woman in the world" in its Dec. 2015 issue. A beautiful tribute to the "Virgo Potens" who looks so well after those who invoke her.

Now that we are invited to party spiritually for 50 days until Pentecost in memory of the triumph of Our Lord

Jesus Christ over death, let us include Our Lady in our joyful feasting.

The British who still revere their queen make a toast at any important dinner and offer the first drink "To the Queen!". Let us do exactly the same. Our Queen deserves the first of everything we have and do: our thoughts, our deeds, all our undertakings and most of all, our prayers.

The grace of Easter might bring some good news this year for those who love the Church and live in the hope of a restoration of her lustre and authority. Pope Francis has given the priests of the Society of Saint Pius X jurisdiction for the sacrament of penance during the Year of Mercy. It doing so, it is clear he had something else in mind.

Pope Francis would not have granted such a favour if he did not consider it a step towards a more final settlement, a step to prepare the minds to accept a future canonical recognition before the end of the Year of Mercy or shortly after. All our three bishops (Bishops Fellay, Tissier de Mallerais and De Galarreta) have been talking about that issue in recent interviews mentioning how the Roman authorities are currently working on a solution that could be acceptable to everyone.

It would be very good news for the Church if, at last, Catholic Tradition is given the possibility to dispense freely its marvellous treasures of grace within the canonical structure of the Church. It would give a boost to the apostolate and vindicate the courageous attitude of Archbishop Lefebvre who never was a rebel but on the contrary a most faithful and devoted son of the Roman Catholic Church.

Archbishop Lefebvre was firm and steadfast because he was sure of God's Will. And along with a boundless trust in God, Archbishop Lefebvre had an incredible love for the Virgin Mary who, in return, showed to him her motherly affection. That is why his ministry was so successful. The reason being also that the Blessed Virgin Mary has a soft spot for Catholic Tradition because it delivers unaltered the message of her Jesus.
