The same student told how once, after Mr. Duff had given a talk on the wonders and the vocation of marriage, he impishly asked Mr. Duff why he had not, in that case, got married himself. With a twinkle in his eye, Frank replied: "Why should I marry and make one woman miserable when by staying single I can keep dozens happy with hope!"

So, even though the Concilium must deal with serious matters, Frank aimed at keeping the legionaries from getting too serious. "God," he said "is the author of humour, for humour is definitely one of the admirable human characteristics." Then he would say, quoting G. K. Chesterton: "It is the test of a good religion if you can make a joke about it."

At Regina Coeli House, Dublin

One sunny day, Frank was in the front room of Regina Coeli looking out the window—no doubt with affection and pride—on a group of the Regina children who were playing in front of the building. One boy, named Frankie, aged about eleven years, seemed to be the self-appointed leader of the group. He was making a lot of noise. Frank Duff couldn't resist having his bit of fun and also taking the youngster "down a peg." He went into the kitchen of Regina Coeli, picked up a mug from the draining board and filled it with water. He "eyed" the open window. Then, realising he needed more "runway" to ensure that the water would be "on target" he opened the door of the adjoining room and backed into it with his mug. This enabled him to "let fly" through the window and poor Frankie got a dousing. The roars, it was said later, were "something awful." Frank, holding the tell-tale mug behind his back, chuckled heartily to himself as little Frankie came to try to identify the perpetrator of the awful deed, saw Frank at the window and shouted out: "It was Miss Daly done it, Mr. Duff; it was Miss Daly, I saw her." The said Miss Daly was, of course, far from the scene of the "crime" at the time!

So engrossed was Frank in his bit of fun, that when he backed into the adjoining room, he did not see anybody there. Now, suddenly, he got an uncomfortable feeling that he wasn't quite alone in the room. He turned around and faced the stupefied stares of a group of legionary ladies who were in the middle of their praesidium meeting. Mumbling an awkward word of apology, he made an undignified and speedy exit from the room.

Fr. Brian Byrne, the Spiritual Director of the praesidium, was the most stunned of all. When he found his power of speech again, he said: "Is that the man we saw with the sanctimonious face at the Concilium on Sunday last?!"

For years afterwards, Frank would roar with laughter as he recounted the incident, giving special emphasis to Fr. Byrne's remark about him.
